The JET Programme, which has been running since 1987, is administered by the Japanese Government and has gained high acclaim both domestically and overseas for being one of the world's largest international exchange programmes. It seeks to enhance internationalization in Japan and promote mutual understanding.

The Japan community has started spring off with a bang, with **Brisbane Seinendan**'s **Matsuri Brisbane** and the **Australia-Japan Society of Queensland**'s 50th anniversary **Evening in the Mt Coot-tha Botanic Gardens**, along with Riverfire, all happening on Saturday 2 September!

Consul-General Ono was also delighted to learn more about a range of exciting **future technologies** and **carbon reduction strategies** that are being developed in Queensland. Mr Ono recently visited **Rio Tinto**'s Control Centre to meet with Japanese university students in Brisbane and learn about the company's operations as it continues to bring market materials critical to the transition to a **low-carbon economy**. In addition, Mr Ono had the opportunity to test drive a **Toyota Mirai**, one of the world's first hydrogen fuel electric vehicles. These emerging industries will see our strong and complementary **bilateral economic relationship** continue to flourish well into the future.

There has also been much happening in the sporting world this month. In the lead up to the Virtus Oceania Asia Games 2022 in Brisbane this 5-11 November, Mr Ono met with representatives from Sport Inclusion Australia and All Nippon Intellectual Disability Sport Association, the latter of whom have donated masks and judo uniforms to the Games. Mr Ono also attended The Gold Coast International Open hosted by Judo Australia, which is ramping up its engagement in preparation for the 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games in Brisbane. It is wonderful to see such positive and inclusive engagement between the people of our two nations through sports.
