

Notice of Standard Reception Resumption From Monday 9 August

From Monday 9 August, the Consulate-General will resume standard reception procedures.

The Queensland State Government has announced that the lockdown for all areas of South East Queensland including Brisbane, will be lifted as at Sunday 8 August, 4pm. Therefore, the Consulate-General will resume standard reception procedures as of Monday 9 August.

Additionally, the State Government has announced that some restrictions will continue to be in effect for the following two weeks. In order to comply with the State Government rules and regulations and to prevent the spread of COVID-19, the following restrictions will continue to be in place at the office of the Consulate-General.

- 1. Before entering the Consulate-General, please wash your hands and sanitise your hands with sanitiser provided upon entry. Your temperature will also be checked prior to entry (contactless), and should your temperature read higher than 37.5degrees Celsius, you will not be permitted to enter our office. Masks must also be worn when entering the Consulate-General.**
- 2. The maximum number of people who may enter the waiting room at one time is seven (excluding families). Should there be eight or more wishing to enter the waiting room at one time, your contact details will be taken down and we kindly request that you wait outside of the Consulate office until you are contacted to enter.**
