Multiple-Entry Holiday Visa Requirements for Indonesia, the Philippines and Vietnam Citizens

ELIGIBILITY

Nationals of Indonesia, the Philippines, and Vietnam with ordinary MRP (Machine Readable Passport)/e-passport in compliance with the ICAO (International Civil Aviation Organization) standard, who wish to apply for a Multiple-Entry Holiday Visa for a stay of up to 30 days and are applicable to one of the following categories:

- 1. Individual who has travel record as temporary visitor to Japan in the last three years and who has ability to pay the travel expenses.
- 2. Individual who has travel record as temporary visitor to Japan and also travel records as temporary visitor to G7 countries (other than Japan) in the last three years.
- 3. Individual with sufficient financial capacity.
- 4. Spouse or children of the individuals who are mentioned (3) above.
- 5. Visa applications are accepted <u>only from residents in Queensland</u>.

- 6. **Only those with a long-term resident status in Australia** can apply for a visa. e.g. Permanent Resident, Work, Student etc.

LIST OF REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

- 1. A valid passport (MRP/e-passport in compliance with the ICAO standard only)
- 2. A valid Australian visa

Please print your Australian Visa Entitlement Verification Online (VEVO) or Visa Grant Notice.

3. One completed Visa Application Form

Please fill in all sections. If a question is not applicable, please put "N/A".

4. One recent passport photograph (taken within the last 6 months)

Australian standard-sized passport photo (4.5cm x 3.5cm) of good quality. If it is not a recent photo, please take a NEW photo and ensure it is printed on photo paper, NOT generic printing paper.

5. Full flight schedule shown with either a screenshot of intended flights or flight confirmation

If you are travelling through another country before you visit Japan, a full flight schedule is required starting from Australia, not only the flight itinerary to and from Japan.

- **6.** A visa for the next country that you will visit after Japan (if applicable).
- 7. A copy of your last Japanese visa stamp/sticker (within the last 3 years)
 OR a copy of your Japan and G7 country visa (within the last 3 years)
- 8. A copy of the Japanese landing permission stamp (within the last 3 years)
 OR Japan and G7 country landing permission stamp (within the last 3 years)

(This is what you receive at the Immigration counter once you land in Japan showing which day you landed.)

- 9. A letter stating why you would like to obtain a multiple-entry Visa and why a single entry will not suffice At least half an A4 length letter and typed, not handwritten. Including details of your interest in Japan, future plans to go to Japan and why you would like to apply for the multiple-entry visa. For families, each person's letter must be different and in their own words (including children although parents can help young children with their letters).
- 10. Documents to substantiate your financial capabilities (A, B and C are ALL required):
 - A) A bank statement or transaction records (savings) for the last <u>6 months</u> showing up until the day of your application and showing the available balance.
 - B) A copy of recent pay slips AND recent letter of employment showing your annual income.
 - **C)** The last notice of assessment from the ATO which shows your **annual income**.

For the spouse or children of individuals who are eligible for a multiple-entry visa, documents to prove the relationship, copy of the eligible person's passport and <u>Letter of Guarantee</u> are required.

For spouses - marriage certificate

For children - birth certificate

If they are not in English a translation is also required
