Consul-General ISHIKAWA and Mitsubishi Development CEO Mr MIZUNO Tadashi enjoyed a visit to Moranbah in Central Queensland, a region which has been a long-term focus of Japanese investment. With Japan being one of

Queensland's major coal importers, they were provided a tour of Caval Ridge, one of five coal mines in the region owned and operated by BHP Mitsubishi Alliance (BMA), which is renowned for producing high-quality coking coal, a crucial component in steel production. Joining the visit was Minister MIYANO from the Embassy of Japan in Australia. Everyone was impressed by the vastness of the mine site and enormous machinery.
